#### We're changing the way we connect.

Communicating with families has always been a top priority for us at Port Elliot Primary. As a school, we are constantly aiming to improve our processes and with the growing use of technology and apps in our everyday, we've made the decision to move to digital roll calls.

This initiative will be supported by an SMS system allowing families to message the school if there is an absence. An automatic message will be sent if your child is not at school and you can respond directly on the number 0418 126 935 with the reason for absence. This message system will replace Skool Bag, which can now be deleted from your phone.

Students arriving after 8:55am or leaving before 3:15pm will be required to sign in and out via the portal (computer) located in the front office.

# WHAT IS SCHOOL CARD?



School Card provides financial help to cover the cost of school fees.

# WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify for School Card, your family's income must be below a specific limit. This limit depends on how many children are in your care.

You must **also** meet at least one of the following:

- have a child or children aged four years or over who attend a school full time
- be an independent full-time student studying year 10, 11 or 12
- be an adult re-entry student undertaking subjects to complete SACE (years 11 and 12).
